What is Truth?

A /HAT IS TRUTH? It is an old question. Many ask it, but few find the answer. Knowledge concerning different departments of nature and life may be true; but they are not the Truth. In speaking, as well as in thinking and feeling, and also in action, one should ever be true. To be otherwise is to deny Truth. Yet these are but qualities of the effect of Truth upon the mind, and the heart, and the inner Being. The Truth is not a quality, although it has qualities. It is not an attribute, though it has attributes. The Truth is comprised in the term the Divine Love and Wisdom, So Truth is known as Love and Wisdom realized: and all else could be but radiations and adumbrations and effects in manifestation of that Love and that Wisdom. A Soul in Truth is not simply and only a Soul seeking for Truth, and striving to be true in its seeking; it is one whose seeking has brought the beautiful realization in which the Soul understands. As GOD is Love and Wisdom, so is GOD Truth. HE is the meaning of all things as HE is the sum of all things; and only in HIM, through HIM, from HIM can a Soul be filled with Truth.

The Star of Bethlehem

THE STORY of the Magians is a beautiful one. It is beautiful even as is found in the Gospel Record, notwithstanding its materialization. It is beautiful even as an outward history when applied (as it now generally is) to the event of the birth into this world of the Master. But if it be beautiful as a story of such outward events, what must it be when its real meanings are beheld by the Soul and realised as an experience? If its charm as an outward history associated with the birth of the beloved Master into these outward spheres, be so great, what shall we say of its spiritual charm and its transcendent glory when it is understood in its true inward meaning? If as a literal story its wonderfulness is beyond the understanding of many, is there any wonder that its inner meaning should appear beyond the apprehension of all who have never gazed into the spiritual heavens, never beheld the angelic objects of those heavens, never seen a star upon those heavens, and know not the meaning of such an appearance?

For the Star which it is said the Magians beheld in the Orient, has once more been seen. The Magians who then beheld it and went to Bethlehem to find the newborn Christ, have beheld its arising once more and have gone forth to seek out the one born in Bethlehem who is to be Redeemer and Christ. The star arising was therefore the Christhood arising before the vision of the Magians. It was the star of Bethlehem which shone so brightly in the heavens, the star of the Redeemed Life whose purity was beautiful to behold, the star which attracted Souls to Bethlehem (the Redeemed Life) when the Christchild was born within the Soul.

THE TALE of The Three Magi is one of the most significant aspects of the whole Christmas story. Of course, this story contains a wealth of meaning on more than one level, a fact that makes it so relevant and fascinating to each one of us. On our spiritual journey through life, there is much to distract us at every turn as we seek to follow the true path. This does not necessarily mean that these sorts of encounters have no special purpose for us, indeed possibly quite the opposite – ironically, they can in fact be helpful pointers to guide us on our journey.

It is interesting to read in the cover-extract how Our Friend's positivity quietly carries us forward in this respect, helping us not only to see with clearer vision but also with a clearer and more intuitive outlook. Thus, The Three Magi can be seen as guides to, or aspects of, 'The Way of Light, Love and Life,' which is something that we can probably relate to – not in a general sense but particularly in relation to our own spiritual journey and aspirations.

In traditional story, the journey of the Magi takes place in winter, with all the various aspects of travelling a long distance at that time of year. This can be seen as a metaphor for the Soul on its journey to seek the Truth and being blocked by the opposing forces who seek to divert it from its true path. The Star, or the light of inner truth, thus becomes their guide and guardian, enabling them to eventually reach their destination. This is surely a blessed help for all of us as we, individually and collectively, seek to reach higher realms of spiritual awareness and understanding.

Thus, as we move forward into a new year (in Earthly terms) we can carry with us at all times the certain knowledge that we are indeed guided by the Star.
